

➤ **Local Law Enforcement must be contacted.** They will provide guidance on what to do and initiate resources to help you effectively respond to the attack.

➤ **Report Cyber Claims Immediately.** For every hour that passes thousands of dollars can be lost and millions of pieces of data can be compromised.

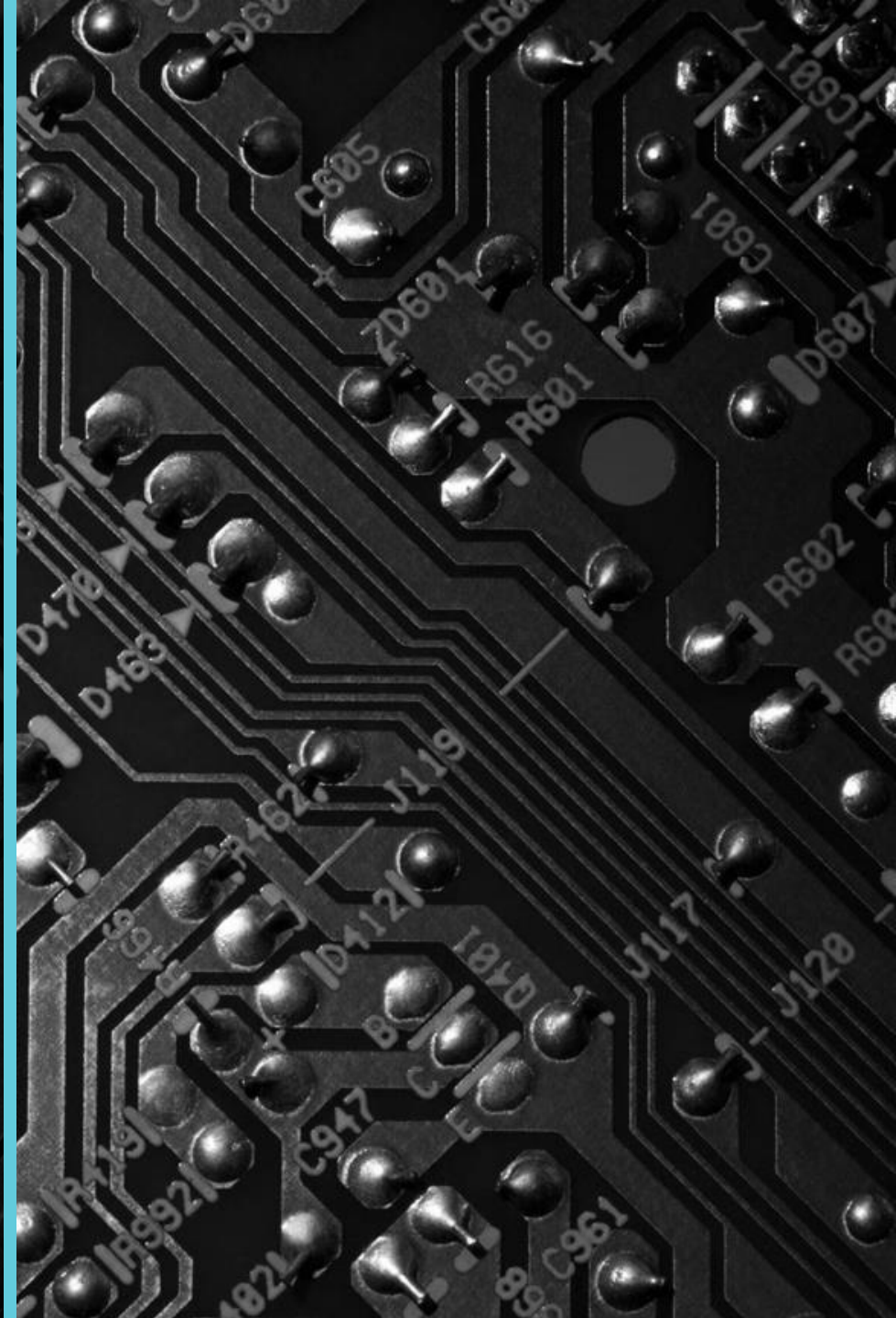


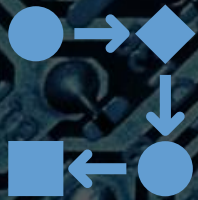



The SDPAA Cyber Credit Program: Tier One

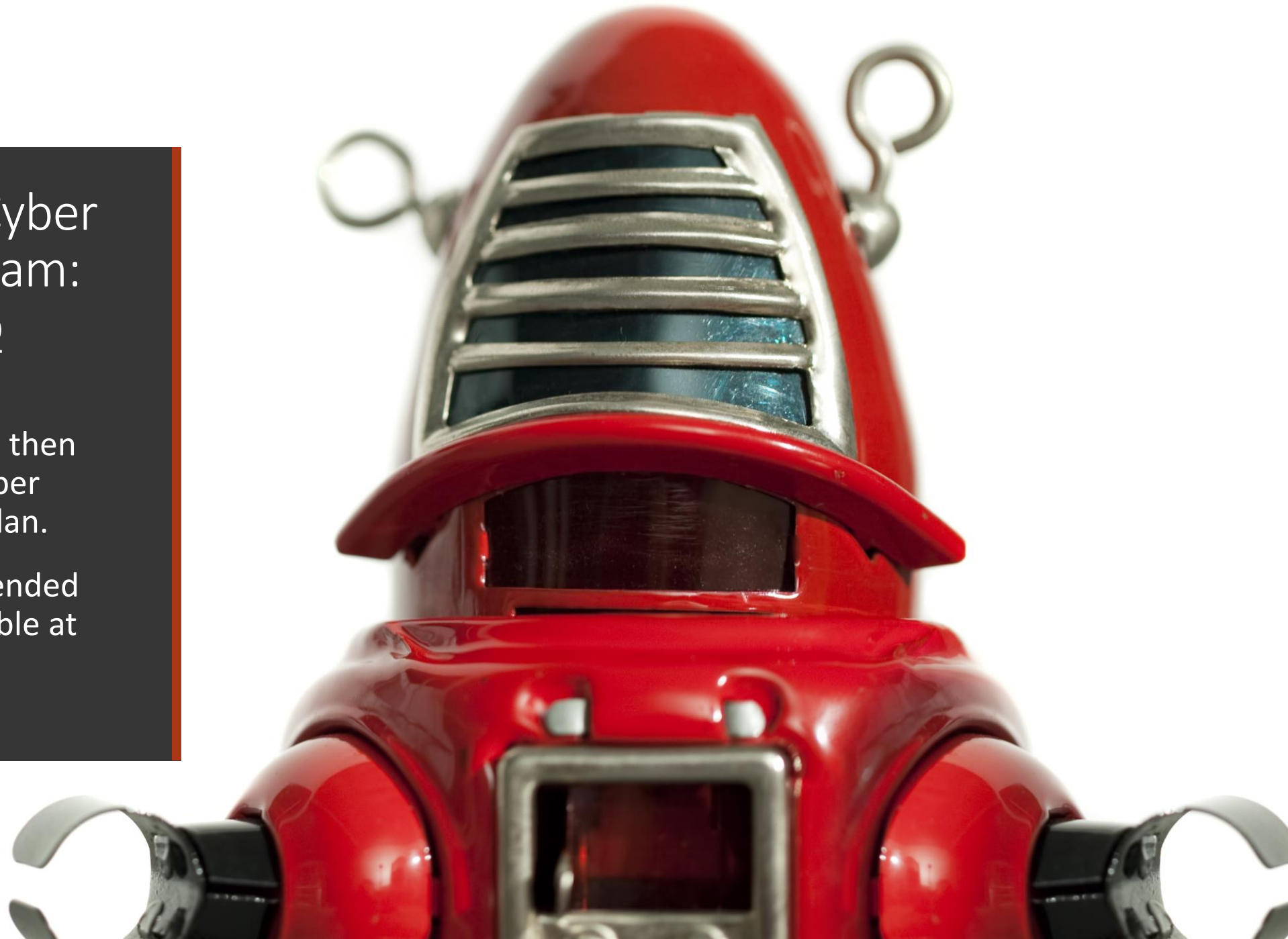
Enrollment in (DSU) Project

The SDPAA Cyber Credit Program: Tier Two

Appoint a “cyber representative” who then works to adopt a Cyber Incident Response Plan.

The SDPAA Cyber Credit Program: Tier Three

Future credit on purchases of cyber hardware/software and related measures to enhance their cybersecurity.
