A Story of Strength: Recovery in Action

- Severe workplace injury caused by a 1600-lb motor.
- Extensive surgeries and rehabilitation services provided.
- Workers' comp assisted with home health, medical equipment, and PT.
- Employee returned to light duty despite challenges.
- Demonstrated resilience and determination in recovery.
- Outcome: Healing well and back at work, contributing to the community.

A Story of Courage: From Officer to Assistant Fire Chief

- Police Officer shot multiple times in the line of duty.
- Workers Comp provided immediate medical, mental health, and equipment support.
- Approved cutting-edge prosthetics for recovery and mobility.
- Returned to work one year later and transitioned from police officer to firefighter.
- Promoted to Assistant Fire Chief, continuing to serve his community.

A Story of Resilience: Recovery in Progress

- Severe burns from a workplace accident involving high voltage.
- Multiple surgeries, skin grafts, and extensive rehabilitation.
- Workers Comp provided home health, pain management, and therapy support.
- Returned to light duty work within months, improving mobility and morale.
- Continued recovery with a positive outlook on work and family.

A Story of Dedication: Supporting Recovery Through Crisis

- Police Officer sustained injuries during a foot pursuit.
- Workers Comp coordinated immediate medical and family support.
- Recovery challenges led to an emotional crisis.
- Adjuster went above and beyond to provide care and get resources.
- Outcome: Ensured recovery efforts supported both the injured worker and their family.
